William E. Carey, 82, Dies following Action by Healthcare Consortium and Chicago Police

Twenty-seven (27) days in his life and death

9	10	11 – Unknown person (one Walter Rice) gains entry, identifies self as “doctor,” searches WEC apt, alarms caretaker. PAC speaks with WR by phone.	12 – PAC calls attorney for advice, VA physician for medical records and letter: “Mr. Carey is well taken care of.” PAC requests WR bona fides via fax.	13 – WR leaves voice mail: he will not provide ID or other credentials. PAC phone inquiries to Healthcare Consortium are not returned.	14 – PAC phone conversation w/ WR, who now wants financial documents. Continued efforts to locate what/who of Healthcare Consortium.	15
16	17 – PAC continues to try to determine identity/affiliation of WR.	18 – WR badgers PAC for legal and financial information.	19 – PAC still unable to confirm identity of WR or standing of Healthcare Consortium.	20 – WEC and caretaker removed from home by WR and unidentified police officer. Rush hospital asks PAC reason for WEC admission.	21 – PAC calls State Police for advice and is referred to three Chicago DOP precincts, but there is no record of any police activity.	22 – PAC eventually locates one Ofc Winburn, who then threatens PAC w/ jail. PAC faxes POAs to DOP and Public Guardian to try to resolve apparent confusion.
23 – Fax to Rush director from PAC: “I am most concerned about the effect this traumatic event has had on my 82-year-old father.” Fax to HCC CEO re WR bona fides.	24 – Second fax to HCC CEO re WR. Still no response. According to Rush, reason for admission: “Alleged physical abuse, financial exploitation.”	25 – PAC to Chicago, despite OfcAW threat. PAC and Rush medical director conclude: “Only about money.” RGF registers complaint with DOP IAD.	26 – PAC in Chicago. Court hearing. WEC ordered home. “The healthcare and property POAs remain in full force and effect.” WEC anxious, unable to sleep.	27 – PAC in Chicago. HCC, PG try to undermine PAC and court order. Medication prescribed for WEC anxiety.	28 – PAC meets w/ ODE management re security. PAC to NYC to collect financial records. PG continues to push for control of WEC assets.	29 – WR shows up unannounced at WEC building, questions residents about WEC finances, PAC, etc.
